




PHOTO/VIDEO GUIDELINES

Photographers and videographers should only set-up in the designated media areas in the back and East transept unless permission is granted otherwise. **They must not enter the prohibited area in red on the included floorplan. Working media can not step into the altar area or onto its marble steps and must stay out of the front aisles** to not obstruct services.

Please no flash photography or artificial lights during liturgies. Tripods must not interfere with worshippers and must remain stationary. In a spirit of reverence, media are asked to be as unobtrusive as possible.

CATHEDRAL HISTORY

The Cathedral of the Madeleine is the only cathedral in the United States dedicated to St. Mary Magdalene. Built on land purchased by Salt Lake's first bishop, Lawrence J. Scanlan, construction was completed and the church dedicated on August 15, 1909. "The Cathedral of the Madeleine" became its official name under the leadership of Bishop Joseph Glass, who also commissioned the beautiful murals in 1918.
